RollArt Processes and Administration

The 2019 Northern Area Champs, held last weekend, was the first time the new RollArt judging system has been used in competition in NZ. Pictured above is the first official judging panel. This was the culmination of many months of hard work by the RollArt Steering Committee, our Judges and Officials, the Artistic Committee and SkateNZ.

While lots of work has been put in by the whole skating community to get us this far, there is still a lot to do! Thank you all for your patience and enthusiasm while we all come to grips with this exciting new system.

After the recent RollArt seminar in Melbourne the following processes have been set to help future competitions run smoothly:

RollArt Equipment

The equipment (computers, headsets, and supporting equipment) is managed by The Chairperson of the Artistic Committee, The Judges Convener and the Assistant Judges Convener, and the Manager of the RollArt Steering Committee. These people are able to sign equipment in and out for transportation to New Zealand events and have access to the register for recording where the equipment is and where it is being used next, at all times.

Loading of Events and Skaters in to RollArt system for Competition

Loaded by Chief Calculator and team. If the Chief Calculator is not attending the event they will nominate another qualified Calculator to load the RollArt system. Event Organising Committees are to send a programme with entries to the Chief Calculator ASAP for RollArt system loading.

RollArt Content Sheets

A link to the program content sheets on the World Skate website can be found on the NZ Artistic Website under “Resources” and then “RollArt Forms”

-All competitions, Regionals and Areas – Program content sheets need to come in with entries to the Organising Committee as instructed on entry form - 1 copy - electronic preferred.

The Organising Committee will then collate the forms, with support from the Chief Calculator and team.

-New Zealand Championships – Program content sheets must be sent to the Artistic Committee Secretary at least 15 days prior to start date of New Zealand Championships - 1 copy - electronic preferred.

The Artistic Committee will collate the program content sheets, with support of Chief Calculator and team.

-International Events - Program content sheets must be sent in with entries to the organising committee as instructed by entry form - 1 copy - electronic preferred

Music Certificate of Authentication Form

These forms can be found on the World Skate website, and the Artistic website under “Resources” and then “RollArt Forms”.

-All competitions, Regionals and Areas, New Zealand Championships – Music Certificates need to come in with entries to the Organising Committee as instructed by entry form - 1 copy - electronic preferred. The organising committee will then hand the forms to the Chief Referee at the competition for reference.

- International Events - To organising committee as instructed by entry forms.

Personal Skater Result Sheets

Within one week after the event the skater result sheets will be sent by the Chief Calculator and team to the Organising Committee Secretary, or Area Secretary for disbursement to clubs. Club Secretaries are then to send the sheets on their members. These results are by event not individual.

Communications

- Any artistic skating rules, requirements, ratifications, general queries are to be sent to the Artistic Committee via the Secretary
- Any Coaching and/or specifically RollArt coaching questions are to go to the HPCC thru their email
- Any Rollart questions, concerns, whilst we are rolling this new process out are to go to the RollArt Steering Committee via their mail
