NEW ZEALAND ARTISTIC ROLLER SPORTS COMMITTEE POLICY 11

INTERNATIONAL TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Purpose:

To fully utilise opportunities and resources, for coaching and/or training, while avoiding conflict of schedules with the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee

To clarify the process for application for a sanction to compete in international competitions other than World or Oceania Artistic Championships.

SANCTION FOR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

Australian National Championships

An Individuals application to compete in the Australian National Championships can only be considered by the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee, when received from the skater's club. This may be approved by the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee. Upon such approval, the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee will forward to the NZFRS Board for ratification and issuing of a sanction.

Other International competitions (i.e. German Cup)

The skater must have competed at Oceania and/or World Championships, in the year immediately prior to their application, in the discipline they want to compete in. An Individuals application can be considered only when received from the skater's club. This may be approved by the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee. Upon such approval, the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee will forward to the NZFRS Board for ratification and issuing of a sanction.

INTERNATIONAL TRAINING

Skaters and/or coaches wishing to train offshore are requested to notify the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee of their plans through their club secretary

INVITED INTERNATIONAL COACHES/SKATERS

Club and/or Private Coaches initiative

Any club and/or private coach/or persons whose intention it is to invite an international coach and/or skater to New Zealand are requested to notify the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee of the proposed invitation before the invitation is issued. This is to avoid clashing of dates of the proposed High Performance plans.
