POLICY 01.

ARTISTIC ROLLER SPORTS BODY TROPHIES

1. ITALIAN TROPHY

Awarded each year to the highest placed New Zealand Artistic skater or team who has placed in the top 50% of their event at the Senior World Championships. This award is the responsibility of the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee.

2. JACK FANTHORPE SHIELD

Awarded for the best performance/s by an artistic skater/s up to and including Cadet level. The selection of this skater/s will be done by Mrs Vilma Fanthorpe in conjunction with the Senior Judge at the New Zealand Artistic Championships.

3. AVIS BERRY TROPHY

Awarded to the Senior Lady who has gained the most points in Figures, Free skating and Solo Dance in the senior grade at the New Zealand Artistic Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee and is calculated by the Chief Calculator.

4. IAN MACKIE MEMORIAL TROPHY

Awarded to the junior lady who has gained the most points in Figures, Freeskating and Solo Dance in the junior grade at the New Zealand Artistic Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee and is calculated by the Chief Calculator.

5. JOE BRIGHT TRAINERS CHALLENGE TROPHY

The Joe Bright Trainers Challenge Trophy is awarded to the artistic trainer who received the highest total points on actual skating placements at the New Zealand Artistic Championships.

POINTS SCHEDULE

Gold Medal 3 points Silver Medal 2 points Bronze Medal 1 point

APPLICATION MUST BE MADE TO THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE ARTISTIC SPORTS COMMITTEE AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE LAST ARTISTIC EVENT ON THE FORMS PROVIDED.

In calculating the number and type of medals won by pupils, the trainer must be considered the PRINCIPAL TRAINER of the medal winner.

TIE BREAKING

If a tie occurs the following procedure will be used to break the tie:

- 1. On the highest number of total medals
- 2. On the highest number of gold medals
- 3. On the highest number of gold and silver medals

6. JOE BRIGHT AGGREGATE TROPHY FOR PRECISION

Awarded to the Club that receives the highest total points on actual event skating placements during the New Zealand Artistic Championships.

Points Awarded will be:-

Gold Medal 3 points Silver Medal 2 points Bronze Medal 1 point

7. JOE BRIGHT INCENTIVE TROPHY FOR PRECISION

Awarded to the individual that has been nominated for their 'Services, commitment and dedication to the sport of Precision, Show or Quartet Skating during the past year'. This award is in recognition of the workers that make the sport happen. Nominations will be called for at the end of the year and the clubs to vote via their delegates at the Artistic AGM at the New Zealand Championships.

8. JOE BRIGHT MEMORIAL TROPHY F OR BEST PERFORMANCE AT GRAEME SHEPPARD CHALLENGE

Awarded for the most outstanding performance at the Graeme Sheppard Challenge by a skater or team. All grades skating at Graeme Sheppard Challenge are eligible for the award. The recommendation/s will come from the judging panel to the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee, who will make the final decision.

9. THE DC SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

The true meaning of sportsmanship is behaving ethically towards others, being fair and reasonable to opponents and humble when competing. This award is to celebrate a skater who has shown these qualities in the sport of artistic roller skating. The emphasis is not placed on the skaters personal skating ability but instead the sportsmanship shown towards their own skating, other skaters and officials.

Nominations must be completed by coaches, officials or other skaters (non-relatives). They should include a brief description on how the skater has demonstrated these qualities over the past year. The recommendation/s will come from the skating community as outlined, to the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee, who will make the final decision.

The award will be presented at the closing ceremony of the New Zealand Artistic Skating Championships.
