Throughout the weekend there were robust discussions, and some things came up that need to be shared before Area Championships.

TWO FOOT SPINS

If a skater has a component of a two foot spin this will be called as an Upright not confirmed.

TIMING

For the skater to get the best chance of recognition of any component with a timing requirement it needs to be accurately recorded on the component sheet. It was noted that many times the technical Specialist could not find the start of the footwork sequence or choreo sequence. It is not the job of the official to search for any component. Coaches, please ensure that you make these components as easy as possible to find.

Times recorded on the Content Sheet MUST be from the first movement of the skater not the start of the music.

Please use the correct codes – with the exception of declaring a lutz jump, we do not need to know the specific jumps or spins or levels of dance element you intend to attempt.







75% RINK COVERAGE


The 2021 requirement for 75% of rink coverage is defined by using three of four quadrants of the floor surface. (These are directional only - edges and lobes are required)

LITTLE WALTZ

Step 16. LFO 3 RBI 3+3 beats and Step 17. RBO Sw 3+3 beats

Steps 16 and 17 make the second corner lobe, that begins with an LFO (step 16) skated toward the short side barrier and composed of a LFO stroke for 3 beats then a Three Turn on the 4th beat to LBI, sustained till the end of the 6th beat. The lobe finishes after a 6 beat backward Swing (step 17) that finishes toward the long axis.

Note; Correct technical execution of the 3 Turn at the top of the lobe, the point of the cusp aiming straight down the floor, on clear and correct edges, not hopped or jumped.

Step 33.

Step 33 **DpCh RBO 3T RFI** (6beats):correct execution of the dropped chasse RBO; correct technical execution and clear cusp edges at the entrance and exit of the **3 Turn** that must the done on the 4th beat with the free leg stretched back after the 3 Turn.

Note; Correct technical execution of the dropped chasse with the free leg finishing at the back in preparation for the 3 Turn, the point of the cusp aiming straight down the floor, on clear and correct edges, not hopped or jumped, and finishing with the free leg at the back.
