## POLICY 13

## NATIONAL RANKING

As Required by World Skate, the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee will produce a New Zealand National Ranking List at the completion of each skating year for each event in a World Skate grade. The NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee will also compile and maintain National Ranking Lists for NZ domestic grades in which skaters compete to National Artistic Championship level.

These National Rankings lists will be used for the following purposes:

To send to World Skate as requested for International Competition Entry
To select the NZ High Performance Squad

Please note: the National Ranking Lists are separate from and calculated differently to the NZ Team Selection List.

The National Ranking Lists for RollArt events will be calculated by taking the average of a skater's **Total Scores** from any of the following events in which the skater competed during the skating year;

Area Championships, Graeme Sheppard Challenge, NZ Championships, Oceania (Continental) Championships, World Artistic Championships and the World Figures Cup.

Skaters who cannot attend one or all of the national ranking domestic competitions because they are skating in an/another international performance (A) competition/s may have their **Total Score** from that international performance (A) competition/s substituted for the score from the missed national ranking domestic competition/s.

Scores gained at international performance (A) competitions will be increased by a factor of 1.5 to account for the increased level of competition at these events.

The factor used in this calculation may be reviewed from time to time by the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee.

To substitute a score, the official score sheet received from the competition must be sent to the NZFRS Artistic Roller Sports Committee.

The National Ranking Lists for White System events will be calculated via a High Point system.

A skater shall earn points at each National Ranking event dependent upon their placing and the size of the event (see points chart).

The points a skater gains at National Ranking events throughout the skating year will be totalled, and the National Ranking List will be ranked in order of highest to lowest points.

In the case of a tie, the scores (or placings in the case of white system events) from the most prestigious event will break the tie.
