

Mount Warren Park, Queensland, Australia

World Skate Oceania advises that the 2023 World Skate Oceania Artistic Skating Championships and Pacific Cup Open Invitational Competition will be hosted by Skate Australia in Mount Warren, Queensland Australia.

The Championship is open to skaters from countries affiliated to World Skate. Sanctions from home federations are required for international skaters.

Dates: **18 August – 22 August 2023** 

Venue: Mount Warren Indoor Sports Centre,

2 Milne Street, Mount Warren Park, Queensland, 4207.

Mount Warren: Mount Warren Park is situated in Logan City between the famous Gold Coast

and the city of Brisbane, approximately 30 minutes by car to the Village Roadshow theme parks, 1 hour to the pristine Surfers Paradise beaches and 30

minutes from Brisbane.

Accommodation Travel and accommodation costs are the responsibility of participating skaters/

team officials and/or their respective National Federations.

Sanction: The championship will be conducted with sanctions and schedule from World

Skate and its sub-committees.



Competitors:

Each Federation shall use its own method to select the team it enters for the competition. Teams selected for competition at the Oceania Artistic Championships shall be the official Team of the country they are representing.

Competitors representing countries affiliated with World Skate Oceania are eligible for World Skate Ranking points for the categories of Junior and Senior Solo Dance, Couples Dance, Pairs and Free Skating.

Events & Entries:

The following is a list of events offered and the number of participants that can be nominated per event from each representative federation.

Solo Dance	Cadet, Youth, Junior, Senior, Masters, Advanced Masters
Free Skating	Cadet, Youth, Junior, Senior, Masters
Inline	Cadet, Youth, Junior, Senior
Pairs	Cadet, Youth, Junior, Senior
Quartets	Cadet, Junior, Senior
Show	Small and Large Teams
Precision	Junior, Senior
Figures	Cadet, Youth, Junior, Senior, Masters, Advanced Masters

For categories Cadet, Youth, Junior and Senior the requirements will be as per World Skate 2023. Each federation may enter up to 7 registrations per event.

For Masters categories, the requirements will be as per the document attached to this bulletin. Each federation may enter up to 5 registrations per Masters event.

Bulletin 2 will contain information regarding the registration process.

Awards:

Skaters placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the Open competition will be presented with Pacific Cup awards. A presentation of World Skate Oceania Championship awards will be made to participants representing federations affiliated with World Skate Oceania placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd.

Spectators:

Entry will be free for team officials, coaches and spectators. Only certified team officials will be allowed in the Marshalling area during training and competition.



Officials:

Panel Officials will be appointed by the World Skate Oceania Artistic Technical

Commission.

For Officials wishing to attend the event for educational experience there will be a mock judging space set up and mentoring opportunities available. There is also the opportunity to judge Pacific Cup events.
